


RAISING YOUNG VOICES

Friedenskreis Halle e.V.

The peaceful revolution of 1989 brought together in 1990 people from various citizen's initiatives in Halle to form the Friedenskreis (Circle of Peace) 1991.

Today our engagement is focused on a dynamic concept of peace: Peace for us is not a state, a far-off goal of simply an absence of war. For us peace is a way to a fair, cooperative, diverse and non-violent co-existence that enables everyone to be free and develop themselves.

We are a political and value-orientated organization, but we do not belong to any party, religion or ideology. In our networking, however, we are open to collaboration and cooperation.

With our work we advocate active non-violence, constructive as well as civil conflict management, active democracy, transcultural diversity and global justice.

Currently the association works in three areas::

- International volunteering and non-formal educational projects: consultation and information for interested persons and organisations as well as hosting-, sending- and coordinating organisation for programmes "Jugend in Aktion", "weltwärts", "EVZ" and "Erasmus+"
- Peace education: own workshops, seminars and trainings in Halle, the region and abroad in cooperation with local, regional, national and international partners as well as mediation of offers and trainers;
- peace politics: actions, campaigns, exhibitions, presentations, lectures and workshops as well as local and regional networking.





PANGEYA ULTIMA

"Development center Pangeya Ultima" is the Ukrainian non-governmental, non-profit organization (est. 2012) composed of youth, youth workers and third sector experts. Main mission statement: Fostering intercultural dialogue, creation of opportunities for personal development and emancipation of people, facilitation of sustainable development of communities.

Programs of the NGO encompass a range of topics the most active of which are the promotion of active citizenship, self-development of people and community development, intercultural dialogue and peace-building, media and communication, arts and culture, entrepreneurship stimulation (especially socially-inclined forms of entrepreneurship) and tourism development, environmental protection and tackling ecologic issues, etc. Since 2022 we are involved in charitable work and assistance to victims of war through the launched foundation.

The activities of the NGO are often based on non-formal education and utilization of international mobility programmes. With this the organization pursues its fundamental mission – facilitation of the intercultural dialogue. This is enshrined in the name concept of the organization – "Pangeya Ultima" is a supercontinent which will ultimately unite all the cultures and knowledge together. The NGO provides intercultural learning and encourages participation in the international context among its target groups, particularly promotes European awareness.

The NGO acts a lot on the local level and state levels, has a considerable profile of international activities. Locally the NGO operates as a center of mobility, non-formal education and self-development, its participants uncover their individual potential and help exploit the potential of own communities for the sake of sustainable development and democratic transformation.

Members of the organization are endless enthusiasts that follow principles of integrity, initiative and goodwill, stand for values of humanity and love for our planet.

And there are the others.




Dayeon, 27, Halle
